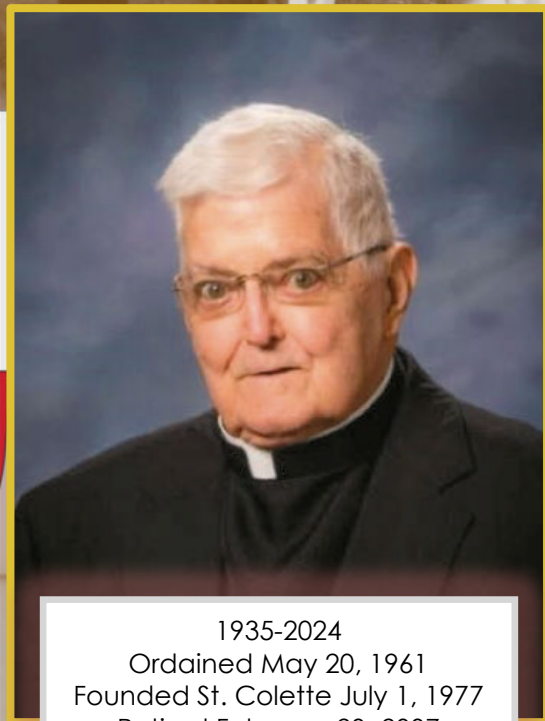

In the Gospel today, Jesus asks the disciples, "What are you looking for?" Mesmerized by the Lamb of God, as he was named by John the Baptist, Andrew and the other disciple realized their heart's greatest desire in Jesus. *In May of 2000 I was to have double bypass surgery so Jan called several local parishes to have a priest visit and hear my confession. - \*\* He loved his martinis. (I think)
- \*\* He had a unique sense of humor.
- \*\* For many years he sent our family Christmas cards.
- \*\* Thank you Father for being our first shepherd at St. Colette Parish.

*a lamp to my feet*

I remember going to Mass at Crestview School when our parish was first formed in 1977. If my memory serves me correctly, we only had two Masses and if you went to the later Mass, 10:00 or 10:30, you had to fold up and put the chairs away so the children could have school on Monday.

Sometime after the formation of our parish, I received a phone call one Sunday evening from my next door neighbor on Nancy Circle, whose house was up for sale, saying that he had sold the house. He would not tell me the buyer's name but gave me many hints to try to guess. He said the fellow was very well educated but kind of quiet and laid back, was single with no plans to get married and that he had leadership qualities and many other hints. Finally, after I could not guess, Gary mentioned it was Father Montavon.

Shortly after moving into the home, Father had a chapel built in the basement. He was a quiet neighbor although he came to many of the picnics, rib roasts and clam bakes that we would have on the circle. At the time there were only about 6 or 8 Catholic families out of the 20 plus homes, but Father fit in very well with all of them. Once the lower level of the Church was completed, we were able to move from Crestview school for Sunday Mass and services. A year or so later when the present Church, Rectory and residences were completed, Father moved from Nancy Circle. He was a good neighbor and a good Pastor. Rest in Peace.

Another tidbit about Father, was that when we were getting married and went to Pre-Cana classes at St Albert the Great parish, newly ordained by a year or so Father Montavon was our instructor.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

**Those Who Seek the Truth**

In my work as a freelance writer, I have a regular column in the archdiocesan paper writing profiles of ordinary people in the local church. Laity, religious, and clergy alike — I hound them all to give me an interview, and when I do, the answer is almost always this: “You don’t want to talk to me. There’s nothing special about me.”

I always try to convince them that there is something remarkable about everyone who is searching for the truth. It is easy to think we are not made for holiness because we are ordinary people with ordinary habits, ordinary abilities, and ordinary sins. It is easy (and very convenient) to designate holiness as something belonging to Better People. People like the saints. People like the Disciples.

The Bible gives us next to no personal information about the disciples. There is no archdiocesan newspaper profile on Andrew and Simon that can give us insight into who they were before they became St. Andrew, Inaugural Disciple and Announcer of the Messiah, and St. Peter, First Pope and the Rock-Upon-Which-Christ-Built-His-Church.

Yet I find myself insatiably curious about it. What was their childhood like? What games did they play with each other as the sun set, before their mother called them into bed? What did they think of as they fell asleep at night? What secret jokes did they share to make each other laugh? What were they afraid of? What did they hope for? Who did they want to be?

Before they were towering figures of salvation history, Simon and Andrew were just two men searching for the truth. When they looked at Christ, there was something that made it click. Perhaps they themselves could not identify what it was, but their hearts whispered it nonetheless: *There it is. We finally found it.*

Isn’t that the best we can all hope for?

Paul saw our physical bodies as a temple of the Holy Spirit, destined to be raised after death just as Jesus was raised from the dead. What are some ways to treat your body with reverence and respect?

**Gospel:**

In John’s account of the call of the first disciples, we hear the first words Jesus speaks in the Gospel of John: “What are you looking for?” Be honest, upfront with Jesus and tell him what you are looking for! He already knows, but he wants you to trust him enough to tell him. ©LPi

And not only that, but to ask me what it is that I’m looking for...singing your song of love, encouragement, mercy, blessing in me... break down the barriers of my heart to receive you more fully. # Saint of the Week!

## St. Sebastian

As with many saints in the early church years, not much is known about St. Sebastian.

What we do know, however, has certainly shaped the sanctity of the church every since! A martyr of the third century, Sebastian is known as the "saint who was martyred twice." He was a Roman soldier under the rule of Emperor Diocletian, one of the most ruthless persecutors of Christians. Sebastian himself, however WAS a Christian, and used his status to help other Christians imprisoned or encourage them in their faith when faced with death. He converted many to Christianity while in his position. Word reach Diocletian of his activities and Sebastian was tied to a stake and shot with arrows for soldier target practice (famously depicted). His executioners thought he was dead and left him there... but he was not ("martyrdom #1). Sebastian was found and nursed back to health, only to return to Diocletian himself and face him for his atrocities to Christians. His words fell on deaf ears, despite Diocletian's awe. Sebastian was clubbed to death and his body thrown in the sewer. It was later recovered by Christians and buried. His relics remain in Germany to this day.

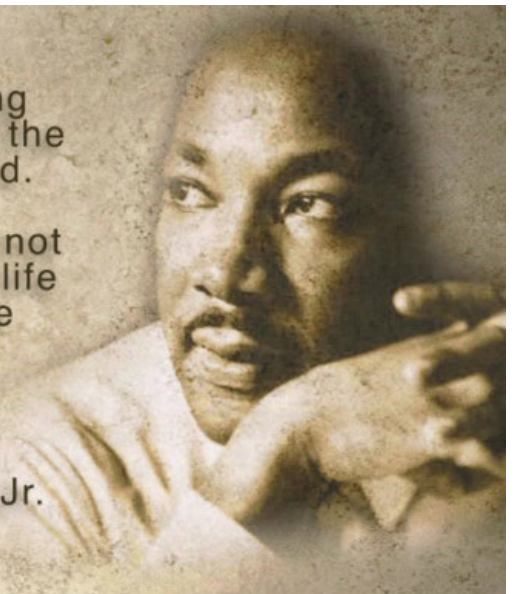
