GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 13, 2022

2nd Sunday of Lent



There is so much wisdom in the first commandment. The daily demands of life, current political ideologies and dynamics, social expectations, corporate philosophies, and even technology can easily become lesser gods. We can find ourselves beholden to and held captive by these secular constructs and systems. Even for those who profess a faith in the one true God, these lesser, attractive but false gods are a temptation. Being overly preoccupied and even obsessed with the state of our present lives, we lose sight of our real destiny and purpose.

Jesus showed his disciples a glimpse of this destiny when he was transfigured before their eyes. In fact, Peter was so caught up in the brilliance, awe, and sacredness of these fleeting moments that he wanted to extend them as long as possible. Wonderful things happen when we

leave our illusions and discover something that is true. This is why creating some sacred space in our lives for reflection, prayer, renewal, refreshment, centering ourselves, and disconnecting from the noise is so important. It shows us how false and shallow our lives can be and what is really of importance. Do you create some kind of sacred space in your life? Lent is a perfect time to do so.

St. Irenaeus, one of the early fathers and martyrs of the Catholic Church, said that, “he who was the Son of God became the Son of Man that man ... might become the son of God.” We mistakenly believe that life is all about us. It’s not. Ours is a journey of transformation in which we become more and more one with the mind of Christ and Christ himself. St. Augustine saw this same transformation occurring when the Eucharist is received. In receiving the Eucharist, we become what we eat, the Body of Christ. Honestly acknowledging false gods that we cling to can open the door for God to show us the wholeness and holiness to which we are called. Take time to discover the sacred. When we do, we will want to stay there for a while. Then, when we return to our personal affairs, we will see more clearly.

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

While we have to be cognizant of our societal and personal responsibilities in this world, we can never lose sight of where our true citizenship lies — heaven. When we become too immersed in earthly things and too preoccupied with our temporal responsibilities, we can actually become numb to our faith. Becoming ambivalent about our faith, our belief in Jesus Christ and the promises of heaven become more a source of agitation rather than a source of promise and hope. It is easy to become an enemy of Christ without even knowing it is happening. God has given us a very clear destiny. We are definitely not meant to conform ourselves to this world but to the transfiguration and glorification of our bodies to come. It is here where we can see clearly not only who God is but who we are. The way many conduct the daily business of their lives suggests that such a promise or hope is of little importance. What does the way you live your daily life say about you?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Parish Registration

Question:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

The Resurrection and Spiritual Hangriness

I want to talk about being *hangry*. I'll give you a quick description of *hangriness*, though I warn you, it doesn't come from the Oxford English Dictionary. *Hangriness* is when you're so hungry you get angry. You turn into a real piece of work. You can't get anything done and you're probably not a joy to be around, at least until you grab a snack. Everybody gets this way sometimes.

We can be this way in our souls, too. It's so easy to get distracted by the hungers of this world: greed, pride, anxiety. We can become ruled by the needs of our bodies and the desires of our mind and, in doing so, neglect the needs and the desires of our souls.

Everyday stewardship calls us to a constant reflection on the truth that we are not made for this world, as Christ clearly shows us in his Transfiguration. He reveals himself in his heavenly glory, just before he is going to be deprived of all earthly needs and wants — even his very life. He shows us that this is what we were meant for. This is what we are striving for.

Lent exists to remind us that we are not made for this world. When you become spiritually hangry — or as Scripture more eloquently puts

It won't be long before we can get out to the Gate of Heaven Shrine. When the weather permits take a moment to offer a Lenten prayer at the Shrine as we await the Glory of the Resurrection of the Lord, Jesus!

I was born in Chicago during the Depression to my Irish Mother and English Father. As a baby, I was baptized in the Presbyterian Church in Flint, Michigan. Later, I sang in the Children's Choir. The song I loved the most was "Jesus loves me, this I know,

for the Bible tells me so." and I believed it! When I was 18, my 48-year-old Father died of a heart attack sitting beside my mother in the car outside of church. The shock and profound loss prompted me to choose a nursing career to help others.

I met my husband, Jack, at a dance and he was devoutly Catholic. The era of the 1950's was when he couldn't come to "my church", so I started going with him to Novenas in "his church". I imagine he was praying for me, certainly his Mother was too. I took Catholic instructions, was rebaptized, gave confession, communion, and confirmation. I got my engagement ring, where else, but in the car of the church parking lot.

We were married in "our church" in 1957. We had four children in 6 short years and 7 years later we were surprisingly expecting our 5th. I felt overwhelmed, wondering how I could manage it all. Two boys and two girls sounded good plan to me, but the Lord had other, better plans. I remember crying out one day to Him and a supernatural Peace came over me. I just knew everything was going to be alright with Christ's help (Phil. 4:13). Our # 5, Julie is a joy!

My only sibling, Mary Ann was the prayer warrior in my life. She was a saint, living with painful rheumatoid arthritis most of her adult life. She never complained and was always praying for me. When Vatican II Council happened in the 60's it was like a breath of fresh air.

The Priests faced the parishioners and spoke in English instead of Latin. Catholics could pray with other Christians/denominations and reading the Bible was encouraged.

The Catholic Marriage Encounter Weekends were so helpful in the 1970's. We learned how to communicate better by writing gratitude and love letters to each other. In the 80's while at St. Collette, we had home group Bible studies, making it a great way to get to know people personally and share our faith.

Some years after my husband passed, my mother, Ann, came to live with me from Michigan. At first, I took her to the Presbyterian Church in Medina and then she came to St. Collette, sitting in the front pew. After one month of this schedule, she said: "Barbara, you don't have to take me to the Presbyterian Church anymore, I don't know anyone there anyway." St. Collette became her home away from home. Everyone greeted her and became her friend, for which I am very grateful. Father Krizner took her under his wing, and she was able to receive communion before she passed at age 103, proclaiming daily: "This is the day the Lord has made, we will rejoice and be glad in it."

As a widow, I have found when you help others, it helps you. That is why I enjoy working with Lisa in the Grief Support ministry "Journey of Hope". I told Father Krizner he can't retire until he celebrates at my funeral. "I'm ready Lord, but not today."

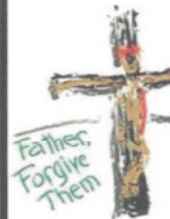
The Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday at 7:30pm.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Patrick | March 17

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ. ©LPi
