

# GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE March 20, 2022 3rd Sunday of Lent

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places. When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage. Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the "I am" of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That's when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God's work, the pondering of life's mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God's presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn't rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don't get lost or confused and stay on course.

# W HY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Priest Vestments

#### **Question:**

Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

#### **Answer:**

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.

Either way, chances are that the fire that was in your belly on Ash Wednesday is burning a bit low. All fires eventually do, once they consume whatever fuels them. So here we would do well to remember what fuels our Lenten fire.

Sometimes we make resolutions that have the appearance of being spiritual, but also have an earthly motive. We give up chocolate hoping to lose weight. We stop gossiping so our friends may like us more. There is nothing wrong with these sacrifices — just with their motivations.

As Moses removes his sandals to approach the burning bush, he sees that the fire burns brightly, strongly — but does not consume. It is propelled by something inexhaustible, something which is not of this world.

Is your Lenten fire fueled by God? Are you daily surrendering yourself to the same voice that boomed from the bush in Genesis — the voice that commanded the Israelites to do what seemed like the impossible?

#### LAMPSTAND

There was no epiphany in my life when I discovered religion. Like many others, I was born and raised in the Catholic faith. My early years were spent in Eureka, California on the coast of the Pacific Ocean where our property bordered a national Redwood forest. It was a beautiful setting in which to live. I don't recall a time when my family life was not centered around faith. My Dad built a beautiful house on a small farm with goats, chickens and lots of rabbits which he raised for the local grocery store (Sorry, Cotton). I knew this and accepted it at a young age but my sister and I made sure we "christened" the new bunnies, sprinkled them with water and put their names in chalk on the hutches. This assured their entry into heaven. Loving God and believing in heaven did not keep me from telling my sister on Sunday that we were eating one of the rabbits she named. (She was two years older than me.)

My sisters and I attended Catholic school, daily Mass and I loved to attend Sorrowful Mother novena on Friday night with my Dad where we sang "Goodnight Sweet Jesus." Both of my parents were devout Catholics in their quiet way and I could not ask for better examples. Their faith was challenged when two of my sisters got polio, the oldest spending months in an iron lung and the other left wearing a leg brace. My Dad could not live with us for a year because we were under quarantine. I felt privileged when my Mom told me God spared me so I could help my sisters. We said the rosary with the radio every night. It was a close, mostly happy upbringing. We moved to Cleveland when I was a preteen and I attended St. Benedict's while our house was being built in Maple Heights. Next, I attended St. Monica's where we again went to daily Mass.

It was only later in life that my faith was challenged when our oldest son died and then again when we lost another of our three sons twenty-eight years later. Life did not prepare me for either — as if any parent is prepared for the loss of their child. I feel blest that my parents gave me the foundation in faith that helped me to somewhat cope. I am not saying life is easy now but I know there is a life hereafter and I will be with my sons again. Although I feel closer to God when I am helping people or doing volunteer work, my goal is to spend more time praying and meditating on Scripture. As my dear Mom often would say, "All for you, Sweet Jesus."

After the doctor left, she said aloud that it didn't make sense, that when she was praying, she saw two red paths like rivers flowing to the wound.

The next day, Saturday, when I went to visit Dad, there was another medical issue that Dad had to deal with. It seemed like one thing kept leading to another and Dad couldn't cut a break. I started to say, "It's like Job...," but Dad held up his hand to stop me. I knew he was using all his energy to stay positive and optimistic and he couldn't hear any more. I had never seen Dad so down and discouraged. I remember going into the hallway at the hospital and yelling at God in my silent prayer. "You said ask and you shall receive, well we're asking. We're doing our part. Dad's a good man. He's a good father, a good husband, a good person, he doesn't deserve this. I am asking you to please help him. If you do, I'll tell the people at mass that prayers make a difference."

On Monday, the doctor once again tried to open the blockage. At first he wasn't successful. Someone in the surgery room made a suggestion and when the doctor tried it, it worked. The doctor came to the waiting room to tell us what happened. He looked up to heaven and acknowledged God's help in guiding his hands during surgery. He said, "Praise God. He guided me and not only was I able to get one artery open, but there were two that opened and went to the wound." God had heard our prayers, and those of the doctor, and answered them. Dad was on the way to recovery with no setbacks.
