## WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

**Question: What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?**

**Answer:**

**T**he practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion. Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way.

# The Fifth Sunday of Lent

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

**March 21, 2021**

**5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent**

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again. When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering, opportunities, and joys of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails. Even in the moments of Jesus' deepest despair, he glorified the name of his Father. What he learned allowed him to put everything in perspective and be obedient to the tender, loving Voice that echoed within. As Lent quickly winds down, may we learn the same! Then, may we gain the fortitude and wisdom to help others see what is right before their eyes.

# Holy Week



**N**ext week is Holy Week. It begins with the events of Palm Sunday and culminates with the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.



It is considered the most solemn week of the entire Church year. Each day of Holy Week draws us closer to the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. The Gospel readings for the entire week will bring us closer to events of Holy Thursday as the Lord will share not only His last supper but also His very self through the wonder and mystery of the Eucharist. The Liturgy for Holy Thursday is solemn, beautiful and brings with it the emotions of the Lord washing the feet of the Apostles and giving them the great mandate that they (we) must do likewise. At the completion of the Mass the Holy Eucharist is removed from the tabernacle and set in a place *separate* while the altars are stripped of their cloths and decorations and the Church is laid bare as we enter into the events of Good Friday.

**Mass is at 7 pm.** The only Mass of the day permitted.

Following Mass the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the Altar of Reposition until 9 p.m. for anyone who wishes private veneration—echoing the words, “Could you not watch with me one hour?”

At 9 pm the Church is closed until **12 o clock Noon** on Good Friday. At that time we will pray the Stations of the Cross.

At **3 pm** the Good Friday Liturgy will be celebrated with veneration of the Cross and an opportunity to receive Communion. Following that service the Church is left empty and bare until the Easter Vigil at 8 p.m.

*(note; the annual Food Basket Blessing will take place at 11 a.m. on Saturday in the church)*

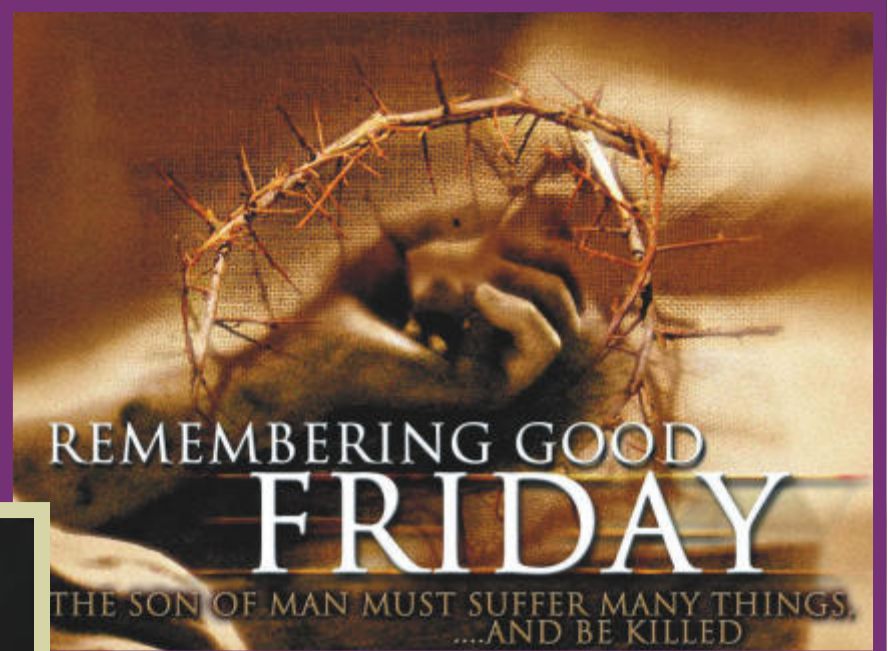

IN STILLNESS  
EARTH AWAITS

On Holy Saturday the Church sits at the tomb awaiting the first light of the first day of the week.

**We await the Alleluia!**





**T**he Paschal candle represents Christ, the Light of the World.

**On Holy Saturday Night, at the Easter Vigil, the Paschal Candle is lit from the new fire outside the Atrium. As it is processed into the darkened church 'Light of Christ' is chanted three times. From the Candle other candles are lit bathing the Church in the Light of the Resurrection.**

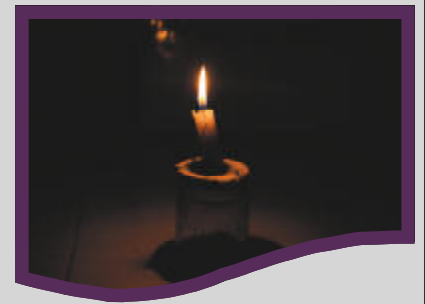
“The pure beeswax of which the candle is made represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother. The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body.

Five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side.

During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night the priest or deacon carries the candle in procession into the dark church. A new fire, symbolizing our eternal life in Christ, is kindled which lights the candle. The candle, representing Christ himself, is blessed by the priest who then inscribes in it a cross, the first letters and last of the Greek alphabet, (Alpha and Omega 'the beginning and the end') and the current year, then affixes the five grains of incense.”

## **T**ENEBRAE SERVICE - Tuesday of HOLY WEEK following 7 pm Mass—March 30

**A Service of Shadows. The service of Tenebrae, meaning “darkness” or “shadows,” has been practiced by the church since medieval times. Once a service for the monastic community, Tenebrae later became an important part of the worship for the people during Holy Week. Join us next Tuesday for Mass and Tenebrae—a moving, and inspirational, service of light and darkness.**
