Project Endeavor APPROVINITION

As of Monday, November 15, the Diocese has fully approved our Building Project. We have provided all the necessary financial information and has satisfied the requirements set by the Diocese. The formal signature of the Bishop will happen soon as he is in Baltimore for the Bishop's Conference: That is simply a formality.

THIS FEAST seems to be timely for the situation of our Nation and the world today. It is right that we honor Christ as the Lord of All.

On Dec. 11 of the jubilee year, 1925, and in order to acknowledge perpetually the supremacy of Jesus Christ over all men, nations and earthly allegiances, the pope issued the encyclical *Quas* Primas, which added the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ the King" to the annual Church liturgical calendar.

In his encyclical, the pope noted that the continuing disorder of that era, what he called "the plague of society," had long been festering and was the result of nations rejecting Christ. "The rebellion of individuals and states against the authority of Christ has produced deplorable consequences ... the seeds of discord sown far and wide; those bitter enmities and rivalries between nations, which still hinder much the cause of peace; that insatiable greed which is so often hidden under a pretense of public spirit and patriotism, and gives rise to so many private quarrels; a blind and immoderate selfishness, making men seek nothing but their own comfort and advantage, and measure everything by these; no peace in the home, because men have forgotten or neglect their duty; the unity and stability of the family undermined; society, in a word, **shaken to its foundations and on the way to ruin.** We firmly hope, however, that the feast of the Kingship of Christ, which in the future will be yearly observed, may hasten the return of society to our loving Savior. In surveying what we will need for Christmas in the church we came across the problem that we promised we would deal with last year—and didn't.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Francesco Antonio Fasani | Feast Day November 27

St. Francesco Antonio Fasani (1681 – 1742) lived his whole life as a loving, devout, and atoning man. He entered the Conventual Franciscans in 1695, and 10 years later taught philosophy to younger friars, served as guardian of his friary, and eventually became provincial minister. When his term of office ended, St. Francesco became master of novices and finally pastor in his hometown of Lucera.

Known throughout his various ministries as being loving, devout, and penitential, he was also a well-known confessor and preacher. St. Francesco was a loyal friend of the poor and worked tirelessly to find ways to support them. He was a mystic with such a profound prayer life and supernatural gifts that he was known to levitate during prayer. He was canonized in 1986 by Pope John Paul II.


