

A Reflection on Fr. Krizner on this dedication of the Good Shepherd Garden weekend. Ben Emerson, a senior at St. Ignatius High School and active member of our parish, wrote this beautiful essay for a college entrance exam. Keep on doing all the things you've learned and seen, Ben! Fr. is proud of you and so are we!

I entered the living room and my heart sank. I stood frozen in disbelief as Annie the dog closed in on the helpless bunny called Cotton. After realizing what was about to happen, I shouted, "NO," and bolted towards them in hopes of liberating Cotton. I swooped in and grabbed Cotton before Annie could lay a paw on him. I was able to bring Cotton back to his cage, from which he, by some means, escaped. "You're lucky that bunny wasn't eaten," said Father Krizner, "I would have had no bunny, and you would have had no job," he remarked jokingly. I paused and, smiling, realized why I loved this job so much.

I met Father Krizner when I was a little boy. He was a man who helped form my character slowly and intentionally through service, sacraments, discipleship and virtue. The first decision he influenced was for me to become an altar server with him after First Communion. After my inaugural Mass as an altar server, I was hooked on religion and my faith. Spending so much time with Father over the following years allowed both our friendship and my faith to blossom. He instilled in me an understanding of how to be a disciple of Christ throughout all aspects of my life. He would inculcate this discipleship in people through service, sermons, or conversations. Through him, I shaped my conscience to respond to adversity with God as my guide. I learned to stand by my faith and never be afraid to defend it. Eventually, Father asked me to come and work for him as a church maintenance employee. I often spent time at work just chatting with him about God or how to be a disciple in the world. Through long conversations, bunnies on the loose, and so much more, I was given the opportunity to become the best version of myself.

Father passed away earlier this year and his death was harder than I thought it would be because I lost more than just a pastor; I lost a mentor, a friend, and a guide on my journey to becoming a Christian man and developing virtue. I have long thought that it wasn't right to show any negative emotions or vulnerability. This loss taught me that it's healthy to let my emotions run free. It's okay to be vulnerable at times because vulnerability makes us human. Despite the grief Father's death caused, it reminded me that it was my mission to execute what Father had long worked towards. It was now my mission to make disciples of Christ as he had done for me.

His wisdom turned into action in my life allowing me to be awarded the Jim Skerl Award for varsity golf. Jim Skerl co-founded many of the service programs I am proud to be a part of today. He was a sincere example of a man who lived for others. The award is given to an athlete in each sport who most emulates Mr. Skerl's character. He was a man that taught, worked, and served for the greater glory of God. As I lay in bed the night I received it, one thing was stuck in my mind: I didn't earn this award randomly. Someone saw the traits of Mr. Skerl inside of me, which is an incredible honor in itself. There have been so many influential people in my life who have led me closer to God, but one person stands out in particular. I have become this person because of Father Krizner. He has molded and shaped me into a disciple of Christ. Now, it's my turn to go out and seek new disciples of Christ just as Father did. As Jesus said, "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19)







