Parish life has certainly been bustling over the past few months. And if you've been in the atrium for the many events or to purchase OktoberFEAST tickets (last chance to do so, btw!), you may have noticed this new statue gracing our atrium entranceway. There's a wonderful story behind it, and perhaps Fr. Tim will share it in time. This rendition of the Good Shepherd is Fr. Tim's personal statue that he got while studying in Rome some years ago. With the completion of the Good Shepherd Garden in the Gate of Heaven Shrine, the timing of it couldn't be more appropriate.

By the time you read this, it will be just under one month until Fr. Tim officially becomes a part of our parish family, becomes our Pastor... our new "Good Shepherd." In getting to know him, it's easy to see that Fr. Tim certainly has the heart of Jesus to lead his sheep to him, a characteristic not foreign to us. Like the Gate of Heaven Shrine encapsulates, Fr. Krizner always led us through the way of the Good Shepherd to the promised Resurrection for all who

believe. That was his ministry. In a similar light, Fr. Tim bringing his statue to our parish symbolizes that he too wishes to follow in these same footsteps, the Way of the Good Shepherd to a fulness of life.

That he desires us more than anything, and to pick us up on his strong shoulders and carry us through both the wonderful and the wretched parts of life.

So we hope you enjoy the new image of this Good Shepherd gracing the walls of our parish. It's Fr. Tim's gift to us, and a gift to communicate that he understands our past and wants to carry us into our next chapter in security and peace. May it and all of the hopeful images of the powerful presence of God we have in our church be a reminder of the God to whom we belong, the "Good Shepherds" who have guided us to him in the past... 


