
Hello September.



The Month of Saints!

Labor Day! The unofficial end-of-summer holiday. While its roots stem from the unrest of labor unions for realistic expectations within the boisterous workforce of the industrial revolution, its significance in 2023 is quite spiritual... and believe it or not, even ties-in with the readings for today.

The Oxford definitions of labor are "work, especially hard physical work (n); to work hard, make great effort, or to have difficulty with something despite making a great effort (v)." It's not a warm, fuzzy word according to the "world", but one that invokes themes of sacrifice, gratitude, and love... Godly virtues. "Work" is a part of life, no matter which way you go around it. And one could argue that anyone who tries makes "that" their own personal career. Sure, there's the cliché saying that "do what you love and you'll never work a day in your life"— and there's meaning in that. But for all of us at some time or another we feel the weight of our jobs and the pressure from others. So where do we find the virtuous joy?


The First Reading from Jeremiah today doesn't give us the context for why he's feeling his particular way, but it's quite clear that Jeremiah has reached a breaking point. He says, "You duped me, O Lord, and I let myself be duped." He feels that his love of God should give him an easy life, and because it's not easy he's willing to throw away his relationship with him. But he can't... because of the "fire burning in his heart" as he knows gold is tested in fire and purpose is earned through sacrifice and labor. God's "labor of love", his sacrifice of sharing his goodness, brought about the whole cosmos of creation and YOU. And then there's his ultimate sacrifice, himself. When confronted with the easy path by Peter, Jesus responded so passionately as to call him Satan, to describe just how worldly the "easy path" is. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." God himself showed us that the Way of purpose is through sacrifice. It's how we're programed. Of course there's balance in all things. Even God rested on the seventh day. But when we wake up in the morning for the daily grind and our "why" lies in the motivation to deny the world and take up our cross, it won't be the job title that defines us, but the knowledge of the one we serve—and in turn, he'll prosper the work of our hands.

So thank you, Lord for the gift of work... for the chance to deny ourselves and give to others. Thank you, people of God for being laborers in his field! And for bringing him to others through the work that you do in your homes, offices, community and beyond. Happy Labor Day! Enjoy the rest!~ Sara



WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortion-providing physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.




